Suspension Data

Black students, students with IEPs, students in temporary housing, and students in foster care receive a disproportionate number of suspensions

- In 2023–24, 43% of superintendent suspensions went to students with disabilities, who were 22% of the population
- Black students made up less than 20% of overall enrollment but received 45% of superintendent suspensions last year
- In 2022–23, about one in every 32 students in shelter was suspended, compared to one in 49 permanently housed students



Effective September 2019

Level 4 Infractions – Aggressive or Injurious/Harmful Behavior

- B33 Engaging in sexual conduct on school premises or at school-related functions (D–I)
- B34 Making sexually suggestive comments, innuendoes, propositions, or similar remarks, or engaging in nonverbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature (e.g., touching, patting, pinching, lewd or indecent public behavior, or sending or posting sexually suggestive messages or images) (D–K)
- B35 Posting, distributing, displaying, or sharing literature or material containing a threat of violence, injury or harm, or depicting violent actions against or obscene, vulgar or lewd pictures of students or staff, including but not limited to posting such material on the Internet (D–K)
- B36 Engaging in physically aggressive behavior other than minor altercations as described under B24, which creates a substantial risk of or results in minor injury (D–K)
- B37 Coercing, threatening, planning, or instigating an act of violence, injury, or harm to other(s) (D–K)
- B38 Engaging in or causing disruptive behavior on the school bus which creates a substantial risk of or results in injury. **NOTE**: Students may also be excluded from the bus as per Chancellor's Regulation A-801. (D–K)
- B39 Engaging in harassing, intimidating, and/or bullying behavior, including using electronic communication to engage in such behavior (cyber-bullying); such behavior includes, but is not limited to: physical violence; stalking; verbal, written, or physical conduct that threatens another with harm; seeking to coerce or compel a student or staff member to do something; hazing; taunting; exclusion from peer groups designed to humiliate or isolate; using derogatory language or making derogatory jokes or name calling to humiliate or harass. (D–K, G–K only, where behavior involves physical violence)

Range of Possible Disciplinary Responses* (see pages 17, 21–25)

- D. Parent conference
- E. In-school disciplinary response (e.g., formal restorative conference, exclusion from extracurricular activities, or communal lunchtime)
- F. Removal from classroom by teacher (subject to the requirement to impose a suspension at five or more semester or four or more trimester removals)
- G. Principal's suspension for one to five school days
- H. Superintendent's suspension that results in immediate reinstatement with a welcome-back circle upon return
- Superintendent's suspension that results in a suspension for a fixed period of six to ten school days with a welcome-back circle upon return
- J. Superintendent's suspension that results in a suspension for 11–15 school days with a welcome-back circle upon return
- K. Superintendent's suspension that results in a suspension for 16–20 school days with a welcome-back circle upon return

Other Discipline



Can only be expelled if over 17 and no IEP

Cannot use corporal punishment

Cannot transfer student without permission

Reasons for suspension

(including date, time, place of incident)

Statement of student's rights






Principal's Suspension Conference



- Student must stay in class until suspension conference
 - Except if "threat of danger"
- Principal must attend conference
 - Decide if suspension is justified
- Parent's rights
 - Present student's version and question witnesses
 - Right to interpreter
 - ODiscuss plan to address behavior





Superintendent's Suspension: Notice



School must get approval and call parent immediately

Parent must get written notice within 24 hours, including:

This is to inform you that at the request of the Principal, your child, **SAM STUDENT**, has been suspended from school by the Chief Executive Officer of the Office of Safety and Youth Development starting on, **04/19/2018**.

Your child is being removed from school prior to the suspension hearing because your child's continued presence in school poses a continuing danger to persons or property or an ongoing threat of disruption to the academic process. If you would like to meet with the principal prior to the suspension hearing to discuss this incident, please contact the school.

During the suspension, your child is to report to the following alternate placement site: 88K992 ALC - Brooklyn Shoices (718) 821-5484 located at 271 Melrose Street BROOKLYN, NY 11206. During the suspension, your child has the right to receive homework and class work assignments. Furthermore, your child will be permitted to take any Citywide or State examinations that are administered during the suspension period for which no make-up examination is permitted by the testing authority, as well as to make up school examinations that may affect your child's academic record. Please contact the Dean(s)/Assistant Principal at your child's school to arrange to do so.

This letter contains critical information about the reasons for the proposed suspension, as well as key dates on which meetings will occur that will affect the outcome, length and services your child may receive if your child is suspended following the hearing.

Superintendent's Suspension Hearing: Options



Adjournment for Good Cause

Plead No Contest

Proceed with Hearing

Superintendent's Suspension: Post-Hearing Decision

Hearing officer makes recommendation based on testimony and all documents in evidence

Within 2 days of hearing

parent must receive notification:

- whether charges are dismissed or sustained,
- if charge sustained, where student is assigned to attend school,
- how suspension will be reflected in student's records, including when expunged

Within 5 days of hearing

 hearing office must mail a full report of Findings and Disposition to the parent

Student remains at alternative education site pending decision, unless the parties agree otherwise

Ch. Reg. A-443(III)(B)(3)(u)

If The Charges Are Sustained...



Superintendent may:

For most infractions:

Immediately reinstate student to school

Continue the suspension for 6-10, 11-15, or 16-20 school days

For very serious behavior, only by DOE main office approval

Continue the suspension for more than 20 schools days up to I year (automatic review for 40 or more school days

Expulsion:

only possible for students without IDEA protections who turned 17 before the school year

- Recommend services
- Grant or deny school transfer, if parent requests

Ch. Reg. A-443(III)(B)(3)(u)

Appeals

Must be in writing, and state grounds for appeal and relief requested

Extensions for good cause only

1st Level: Chancellor/Office of Legal Services

Timing:

Must file within 20 school days of date of decision or 10 school days from receipt of tape recording or hearing transcript, whichever is later

2nd Level: NYS Education Commissioner

Timing:

Must initiate within 30 days of decision, unless delay is excused by Commissioner for good cause shown in the petition

Alternative Instruction



During principal's suspension or while waiting for suspension hearing:

K-8: full-time instruction

High School: at least 2 hours/day



After suspension hearing

All students who continue to be suspended have right to full-time instruction.

School Deemed to Know



Right to Expedited Evaluations



Suspended students must get expedited evaluations when:

Parent requests an initial evaluation

School is "deemed to know" student has a disability



Must be done within 15 days of parental consent



What is an MDR?



Meeting to decide if the student's behavior was:

caused by the student's disability;

OR

a result of the school's failure to follow the student's IEP or BIP



Is it a Manifestation?



YES

- Student returns to school
- School must do:
 - Functional BehavioralAssessment (FBA)
 - Behavior InterventionPlan (BIP)

NO

- Suspension continues
- School must:
 - Create a SuspensionPlan
 - Consider doing an FBA and BIP

- A representative of the school district knowledgeable about the student and the interpretation of information about the student's behavior (e.g., school psychologist, social worker, guidance counselor);
- The parent (the parent may participate in person or by phone); and
- Other individuals as determined by the school district and/or the parent (other individuals may participate by phone
 if necessary).
